FREE SCHOOL MEALS AND THE KNAVESMIRE OFFER

If your family qualifies for free school meals (aside from the universal free school meals for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) you will also qualify for The Knavesmire offer. This means, in addition to free school meals, families can be provided with:



- a school jumper <u>or</u> a school cardigan
- a school footwear voucher
- School milk
- one term free swimming travel costs
- two half-terms of free extra-curricular club participation
- free school trips
- negotiated costs for residential visits

Please come to the school office for a form so we can order your child's jumper/cardigan, shoe voucher and milk.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS ELIGIBILITY

Free School Meals are automatically applied to all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. This entitlement can be extended to children where families are in receipt of certain benefits and earnings do not exceed a threshold. These benefits include:

Universal Credit, Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Child Tax Credit (but not Working Tax Credit)

RECEPTION MESSAGES

We have had a great first week back. We have started our new Big Idea which is all about Lifecycles and we learnt about tadpoles. We have got a set of frogspawn in the classroom and we will be watching as they transform into frogs. We have also been learning about cress and started to grow our own with an experiment to see how they grow under different conditions. In Literacy, we have been writing about spring animals and in Maths we have been learning about 3D shapes and practising subitising and recalling number bonds to 5. In phonics, we have started phase 4, this half term focuses on reading words with adjacent consonants then it moves onto adjacent consonants with digraphs. Have a great weekend!

YEAR 1 MESSAGES

Everyone has returned to school with lots of energy ready for the summer term! We have started our new Big Idea which is about plants and how they grow and our end goal is to design and make a sculpture of an imaginary plant. In English, we have re-told the story of Jack and the Beanstalk with actions and have drawn a story map to show key events. In Maths, we have been counting in multiples of 2, 5 and 10 which we have really enjoyed. Please make sure your child has a complete P.E. kit in school, including trainers or plimsolls. We have P.E. on Tuesday and Wednesday, but kits need to be in school all week in case we have additional sessions. Next Thursday, Mrs Gage's class will have Forest School so please make sure your child has a coat with them if they are in 1G.

YEAR 2 MESSAGES

Year 2 have had a great first week back after the Easter holidays! We have launched into our new Big Idea of Lego, exploring when Lego was invented and who it was invented by. Everyone was intrigued to learn that Lego was originally wooden toys before moving onto the plastic bricks that we recognise 17 years later! In maths we have been learning all about place value and different ways that we can show the hundreds, tens and ones in numbers. In English we have been making a start on our narrative unit and understanding how to plan a narrative by using a story mountain to break it down.

YEAR 3 MESSAGES

The children have settled back in extremely well after their break and we are excited to begin our new Big Idea. We have looked at the importance of being fit and healthy this week and looked at the different food groups and how they help our bodies in different ways. During our English lessons, we have continued recapping the features of instruction writing in preparation for writing our own over the coming weeks. In Maths, we have looked at the properties of 2D and 3D shapes and we have even created some of our own using blu-tack and straws. Next week, we will focus on telling the time so any help at home with this would be greatly appreciated. We will also cover adding/subtracting amounts of time and converting between different units of time. Maths homework is ONLINE this week. There is a task linked to shape and a times table task. We will now cover more than one X table a week to continue to improve fluency. Spelling homework will be homophones.

YEAR 4 MESSAGES

In Year 4, the Summer term kicked off with enthusiasm and excitement as we began our Ancient Greece Big Idea topic. Our English unit will be focussed on narratives, which we plan to turn into comic strips. The children started by examining the features of comic strips, where they identified the use of action, speech and onomatopoeia. Maths has been all about decimals this week, where the children have learned to recognise and partition decimals, next using them to make whole numbers. In Big Idea, we have identified when the Ancient Greek period was on our timeline, examined Ancient Greek artefacts and explored the idea of democracy by taking part in a vote.

Over the next couple of weeks, we will be using film clips to inspire our writing. We will be using short clips from the film Hercules and Percy Jackson to help inspire our Greek narratives.

Next Tuesday afternoon, we are going to explore the local area and complete some geography fieldwork. We also have Sam Watda (a computer specialist) coming in on Wednesday afternoon who will be talking to the children about user experience (UX).
